Instructions

1. Glue this sheet to a piece of cardstock paper.
2. Color the box (if you want).
3. Cut out the box along the outside of the solid lines and the slit for the coins.
4. Fold on the dotted lines.
5. Put glue on the tabs and form into a cube, with glued tabs inside.
6. Let it dry.

Now you can start putting your pocket change in there! Once it's all full, you can either bring it back to the Discovery Center or ask your parent to make an online payment for the same amount at wycliffe.org/kids-give.

Every penny, nickel, dime and quarter you put in the box is important and helps give kids the chance to learn how to read, just like you do! And when they can learn to read, they get the chance to read the Bible and learn about God's amazing love for them. Now that's awesome!
